Main Areas of Work and Responsibilities

Supporter scheme/Individual giving:

- Lead a review of our current supporter scheme making changes that will attract, engage and inspire a broader range of people to support Earth Trust and maximise retention rates through excellent supporter stewardship.
- Coordinate any exclusive supporter benefits to be determined following the "Friends Scheme" refresh
- Recruitment of new and uplift of current donors with first class stewardship and retention using a donor focused approach.
- Manage an annual calendar of public fundraising appeals, managing the complete process and working closely with the Communications team, you will oversee all aspects from initial concept, messaging and segmentation through planning and implementation to post-appeal review and analysis.
- Identify and help cultivate successful giving relationships with potential major donor prospects; being mindful to all the possible giving opportunities
- Manage 'In Memorial' commemorative fundraising products, including but not limited to: the sale and stewardship of memorial benches on the Earth Trust farm and other ET managed sites; the sale and stewardship of memorial trees planted on the Earth Trust Farm
- Working alongside the communications team, develop a community fundraising toolkit and a devise a plan to incorporate these tools to raise community fundraised income
- Help recruit and then train and manage Community Ambassador Volunteers. Devise and implement the seasonal calendar of volunteer shifts at ET owned and managed green spaces to engage visitors and promote the membership scheme.



Database (ongoing):

- Maintain excellent records of all donor interactions, payments and preferences using the CRM database, ThankQ
- Using the CRM database, ThankQ, regularly review donor prospect strategies, updating approaches and future steps and actions as required
- Using the CRM database, ThankQ, undertake prospect research to identify suitable candidates for each appeal, campaign or ask
- Review current green gift offering and amend current or add new supporter products working with the communications team to market them

Management Responsibilities:

- Manage the Fundraising Coordinator ensuring excellent individual donor stewardship and accurate record keeping as well as developing them in their role
- As a budget holder for all individual giving income streams, devise, manage and report progress on income/expense targets and devise mitigations where required

The Earth Trust Capital & Revenue Projects (as required):

- Work with members of the senior management team to combine capital and revenue projects into attractive packages for individuals and for grant funders, help identify prospects and solicit bids for funds
- Manage the process of the grant application for any applications you are leading, from working up and developing the project with key colleagues for the initial expression of interest, through to the final full application submission. Ensuring that all application criteria are met and that the funding stream is a good strategic fit for Earth Trust's project objectives
