Become a Community Warden Volunteer

The Volunteer Wardens assist the Land Management Team with maintaining a visible presence on the Community Reserves we manage in order to ensure that they are safe and clean for people to use and also to act as a link between the charity and the local community.

What does the role involve?

Visit a site once a week/once a month and check on specific features on the reserve e.g. benches are intact and not vandalised or gates are in good working order.

- Report any out of the ordinary things you think the Land Management team should know about.
- Provide an early warning about threats to the health and safety of the visiting public, such as fallen or broken tree branches; large holes in, or damage to footpaths; the presence of broken glass or other dangerous rubbish etc.
- Provide the Land Management team with details of any inappropriate behaviour or vandalism.
- Make a note of any interesting wildlife, flora and fauna, that you spot on your visit.
- Litter pick as you warden the Community Reserves.
- Use an online form to report back to Earth Trust after your visit to let the land team know how it went.
