Become an Earth School education volunteer

The Education team offers the opportunity for young people to take their classroom based learning and come to understand its importance in a real world setting. Our curriculum linked Earth School workshops have been developed with teachers in mind, with a focus on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), the Arts and human history for Key Stages 1-4.

Every workshop is designed to make full use of our woodland, meadows, farmland, rivers and wetlands, and heritage sites. They are run by an Earth Trust staff member, working with the teachers / support workers.

Our Education Support volunteers assist the education team to deliver Earth School sessions to a mainstream primary audience. This is a rewarding role where you can match your love of people with your love of the outdoors.

What does the role involve?

Our Earth School education volunteers assist the Earth Trust staff member and engage with teachers and children. Activities include:

- Supporting staff throughout the day, ensure school staff and children feel looked after
- Setting up before sessions and packing away after
- Assist staff to run hands on activities in the afternoon



What skills and experience do you need?

We thrive on your enthusiasm for Earth Trust's work and mission!

Most of our volunteer roles do not require in-depth previous experience as we provide training & support, but the following skills and attributes would make you particularly suited for this role:

- Experience of working with young people/children advantageous
- A love of the outdoors
- Willing to turn your hand to any task
- Patience and a sense of humour
- Some physical fitness is required

What you will gain

This is a rewarding role where you will gain experience of working with children in an outdoor environment away from the standard classroom environment. Build relationships with different members of the team and the students that attend.



What support will you receive?

All volunteers receive our Volunteer Handbook and you will be invited to learning & development events throughout the year. In addition you will be supported by our Education team and have a dedicated staff member to support and offer role specific training. You will always be with the Earth Trust member of staff leading the group. You will not be expected to lead or plan sessions or be left on your own with an individual or group.
