Become a Volunteer Forester

What does the role involve?

A variety of tasks around Forestry and Woodland Management may include the following:

- Taking measurements of trees to create a detailed inventory of our woodland holdings.
- Pruning trees to develop good form for the timber market.
- Tree planting.
- Maintenance of fencing, tree guards and other woodland infrastructure.
- Woodland condition and deer impact surveys.
- A mix of lone and team working.

What's in it for you?

As part of our new team of Forestry Volunteers you will learn all about the complexities of managing a woodland habitat. From individual tree management up to looking at a wood as a whole to assess its quality for wildlife, timber and it's general health.

You will have a key role to play in the ongoing management of Paradise Wood, one of the UKs leading research collections and learn about the variety of research taking place on site as well as getting a chance to contribute to that research. Time required

To be confirmed – the Forestry Volunteers team are really flexible. Times can be discussed on an individual basis.

Initial training will cover forestry mensuration (measuring timber) but will include habitat surveys, hand tool use and potentially some power tools.

Alongside all of that you will be out and about in our woods, a great way to keep fit and enjoy the health and wellbeing benefits of spending time in amongst the trees.

What skills and experience do you need?

We thrive on your enthusiasm for trees and woods!

Most of our volunteer roles do not require in-depth previous experience as we provide a full induction, but the following skills and attributes would make you particularly suited for this role:

- A desire to learn about forestry principles and balancing commercial enterprise with habitat management.
- A willingness to be out and about in all weathers.
- All training, tools and PPE will be provided.
- An understanding of the importance of health and safety.
