Manual handling; Muscular or skeletal injury, Lacerations, Puncture wounds.	Staff and volunteers	Avoid the need for hazardous manual handling where possible. Use mechanical aids where possible; sack barrow or tractor for example. Minimise the distance as much as possible. Remove obstacles from route. Keep the load close to the waist. Get a good hold and adopt a stable position. Start in a good posture – knees bent with straight back. Avoid twisting the back or leaning sideways. Keep the head up when handling. Move smoothly. Don't lift or handle more than can be easily managed. Take frequent breaks to avoid muscle strain and fatigue.
