What does the role involve?

They will be completing a range of land management tasks under the watchful eye of an experienced land management session leader:

- Caring for our Arboretum
- Hedge planting and maintenance
- Wildlife habitat creation
- Path clearing and repair
- Work on our Scheduled Monument
- Coppicing
- Managing Great Crested Newt habitat

The group will receive training in the safe use of a variety of tools including:

- Bowsaws & pruning saws
- Loppers
- Shears
- Digging tools
- Scythes

Time required: 9am-1pm every 4th Saturday of the month

Frequency: Monthly

Location: Earth Trust workshop, OX14 4QZ

What skills and experience do you need?

• Be aged 15–18 and either completing your Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award or have previously volunteered with our Young Persons programme.

- A passion for the outdoors
- An interest in wildlife, conservation, and species identification
- A friendly, welcoming attitude when meeting members of the public
- There is also the opportunity to attend our Saturday land management work party at Wallingford Castle Meadows, 10am-1pm every 2nd Saturday of the month

What support you will receive?

- Induction session covering role expectations, safeguarding, and risk assessment
- Gloves, uniform, and all tools provided (please bring sturdy boots or walking shoes)
- Task-specific training and verbal risk assessment at each session
- DBS-checked session leader present at all times. Parents are welcome to attend—just let us know in advance.
