Escape the classroom and surround yourself with nature at the iconic Wittenham Clumps. We have designed a day that will immerse your pupils in the great outdoors and spark their curiosity for all things living. We will go on a habitat safari of woodlands, wildflower meadows and ponds, taking the time to get up close and personal with creatures great and small. Your pupils will learn about adaptations and discover the vital role that invertebrates play in our ecosystems. Through handling and observation they will come away with a new respect and love for our marvellous minibeasts.

## Learning Outcomes

In addition to immersing themselves in our unique outdoor classroom, pupils will be able to:

- Identify and group a variety of marvellous minibeasts, supported by real-world experience.
- Understand the vital role of insects in food chains and wider ecosystems.
- Observe adaptations in minibeasts found to suit their environment.

- Understanding the world (EYFS).
- Working scientifically: observing closely using simple equipment; identifying and classifying; gathering and recording data.
